Dear Resident,

Woodbury Road and Hume Avenue, St Ives – Proposed parking restriction and pavement marking.

Council is seeking your input on the proposal to extend the “No Parking 8am-9am, 3pm-4pm School Days” on the northern side of Woodbury Road, St Ives and to install double barrier line marking on Hume Avenue, St Ives.

Background

Council has received a request from Brigidine College, St Ives to extend the “No Parking 8am-9am, 3pm-4pm School Days” zone on Woodbury Road. The Road Rules allows drivers to stop for up to 2 minutes in a “No Parking” zone to pick-up/drop-off passengers or load/unload items. The existing school pick-up/drop-off zone on the northern side of Woodbury Road is 19 metres, accommodating about 3 vehicles. Due to the limited car spaces available, many parents stop illegally in the adjacent “Bus Zone”. This causes disruption of buses servicing the school. Both Brigidine College and the local Police that regularly patrol the area supported the extension of the existing pick-up/drop-off zone.

During School peak hours, some drivers make three-point turns at the intersection of Woodbury Road and Hume Avenue as a short-cut to get back onto Mona Vale Road. This is unsafe and disruptive to the heavy traffic flow during school pick hours.

Proposed changes

To resolve the above issues, it is proposed that the existing “No Parking 8am-9am, 3pm-4pm School Days” zone on the northern side of Woodbury Road be extended to Gate 5 of Brigidine College, and that 10 metres of double barrier line marking be installed on Hume Avenue as shown on the **attached** Plan No. *Woodbury/TDA/19/25*.
